Since she began quilting in 1990, Sue has exhibited in Australia and internationally in invitational, juried and touring exhibitions.

Her designs are heavily influenced by the dramatic Australian landscape, having lived and travelled widely throughout the continent.



Sue has a distinct style of art quilting and is recognized for her original work that incorporates numerous surface design techniques and stitches. She is drawn to colour and the textural possibilities of the quilted surface.

Sue has been awarded any prizes for her distinct, original art quilts. She has been invited to exhibit in international & group exhibitions throughout Australia, New Zealand, the United States of America, Great Britain, Europe, South Africa, Taiwan & the Middle East. Her prize winning

work is represented in public and private collections. "What Would You Take?" was the winner of Australian Quilts in Public Places 2001 and was acquired by the Immigration Museum, Melbourne.

Sue works in the quilting industry as a tutor, judge and curator, is frequently published and is a member of Studio Art Quilt Associates, Ozquilt Network, The Quilters' Guild of NSW, Queensland Quilters and Sunnybank Quilters.

At the International Quilt Show in Houston in 2011 Sue will have her own exhibition called Destination Texas. "Australian quilter Sue Dennis presents a personal view of a small corner of rural Texas. During a three-week artist residency on a farm with inspirational surroundings, she created printed and rubbed fabric designs, and these form the backbone of this unique exhibition."

Saturday - Sunday Workshop **GARDEN TRELLIS**

[suitable for all skill levels]

Have you ever wanted a garden that didn't need watering, fertilizing, pruning or mulching? Well this is the one for you. Stitch your garden trellis & then make tiles to hang on the trellis in numerous configurations. Change your display easily depending on your mood or season. Techniques covered include- Broderie Perse, dimensional leaves, appliqué, painted fusible, couching, soluble thread work, texturisation with free motion quilting & embellishing.



Monday - Tuesday Workshop **OPAL FEVER**

[suitable for all skill levels]

Australia's National gemstone, the opal, captures the imagination with mysterious depths of colour. This is your chance to make a small quilt featuring this colourful stone which has been used by Sue in a number of her award winning quilts. "OPALS" was featured in Australian Patchwork & Quilting magazine Vol 13 No 5. Using oil sticks, angelina fibres and appliqué you will be guided in the creation of your unique gemstones. Students choose 1 of 2 designs supplied by the tutor.
